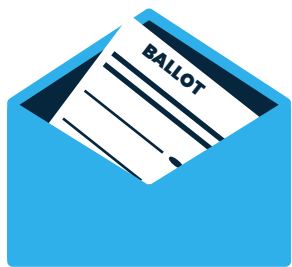


VOTING JUST GOT EASIER.

With the passage of Proposal 3 in the November 2018 election, Michigan citizens have more time to register to vote and more choices about when and how to vote.

Here's how you can easily make your voice heard:

VOTE EARLY FROM HOME



- 1) Contact your city/township clerk for absentee ballot app or download at michigandems.com/absentee
- 2) Fill out the application and mail, email or fax to your city/township clerk. Your ballot will be mailed to you.
- 3) Vote your ballot, sign the envelope, and mail it to your city/township clerk or drop it off in person. Your clerk must receive the ballot by 8 PM on Election Day to count.

VOTE EARLY AT CLERK'S OFFICE



- 1) Go to your city/township clerk's office, register to vote if you aren't already, and get an absentee ballot application by 4 PM on the Monday before Election Day. Find your clerk's address at michigandems.com/clerk
- 2) Fill out the application and receive your ballot from the clerk.
- 3) Vote your ballot, sign the envelope, and deposit into ballot box.

VOTE ON ELECTION DAY

Polls are open from 7 AM to 8 PM on Election Day
Find your polling place at michigandems.com/pollingplace

ALL ELIGIBLE CITIZENS CAN REGISTER TO VOTE THROUGH ELECTION DAY.

UNTIL 15 DAYS BEFORE ELECTION DAY

REGISTER TO VOTE AT:

Secretary of State branch offices
Your city/township, or county clerk's office
Designated State agencies
A voter registration drive

STARTING 14 DAYS BEFORE AN ELECTION THROUGH 8PM ON ELECTION DAY

In person at your city/township clerk's office

YOU MUST HAVE PROOF OF RESIDENCY

Acceptable Documents for Proof of Residency

(Docs must have name and current address. Electronic copies are okay.)

MI DRIVER'S LICENSE
MI PERSONAL ID

PAYCHECK
GOVT. CHECK OR DOCUMENT

UTILITY BILL
BANK STATEMENT

Voters who register at their clerk's office on Election Day can vote there or take their receipt and vote at their polling place.
